Annual celebration returns this weekend

In the midst of all the Halloween festivities, carnival rides, entertainment and an abundance of food, it may not dawn on some just how much work goes into getting an event that has become a staple in the community ready to go each year.

In fact, last week staff members at the Mokena Community Park District were busy cutting down roughly 1,000 cornstalks, which will be used throughout the entirety of Main Park for decoration in preparation for this year's 34th annual Halloween Hollow set to return this weekend, Oct. 16-18 at Main Park, 10925 W. La Porte Road, in Mokena.

"That's the thing, I don't think a lot of people realize all the hard work that goes into the event, and that even stems down to the small details, including cutting down the cornfields," said Erin Cortilet, recreation supervisor for the Mokena Community Park District.

Cortilet said she and the staff have been grateful to work with local farmers in getting permission to use the fields, which is just one on the many activities planned for this year's Halloween Hollow.

Starting on Friday, Oct. 16 from 5-9 p.m., Halloween Hollow will welcome the return of the Windy City Carnival with wristband specials throughout the weekend. There will also be horse rides and a haunted laser tag zombie attack on Friday.

On Friday only, guests will also get a chance to try out some video games as Gamin' Ride Mobile Video Game Theater will be offering a free mobile gam-

ing lounge for children and teens at the trailer.

A full day of activities are then on par for Saturday, Oct. 17 from 1-9 p.m., which will feature free contests throughout the day, including the "Hocus Pocus" Hula Hoop Contest, Incredible Inflatable Guitar Contest, the Jack-O-Lantern Contest and the Great Pumpkin Weigh-In Contest, which this year includes a new element to the pumpkin patch area.

"We've made it a straw maze to the pumpkin treasure is what we're calling it, so kids and families will have the opportunity to go through the straw maze to find the pumpkins, and then after that time, they can go right into the Home Depot Frankfort area for the free pumpkin painting," Cortilet said.

Saturday also includes an array of games, giveaways, a bounce house, an inflatable haunted house, food and the return of the monster market. There will also be a performance from All About Music & Children's Theatre previewing scenes from its upcoming "Disney's Sleeping Beauty," as well as the return of the Mummy Wrap

Contest for boys at 6 p.m. and the Scream Queens Contest at 7 p.m. for girls. New this year will be the Pumpkin Pie Eating Contest at 5 p.m.

There will also be special guest appearances and meet and greet times with several characters starting at 1:30 p.m. with Jedi Mickey Mouse, followed by Michaelangelo from the Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtles stopping by, as well as Optimus Prime and Spider-Man.

"I think the kids will really enjoy having a lot of the interaction with the new guests that we will have in attendance this year," Cortilet said.

Then on Sunday, free contests will begin every hour from 1:30-5:30 p.m., starting with the Costume Contest at 1:30 p.m., followed by the "Hocus Pocus" Hula Hoop Contest, Incredible Inflatable Guitar Contest, Hallowen Rock LimBOO Contest and the Hallow-TEEN Zombie Make-Up Contest.

There will also be meet and greets with "Ghostbusters" at 1 p.m., Chippy the Chipmunk at 2:30 p.m. and Olaf at 4 p.m. Performances will also take place
